An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **712 awareness** sessions educating **2,052 individuals** on health, education, civic rights, and COVID-19
- 2. Planted **741 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 619 children (211 boys and 408 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **440 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered 545 CNICs, 03 B-forms, and 11 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **1,045 animals** with the help of Livestock Department

Women leaders of LSO Nazarpur are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are also taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Stopping Polio Forever

During the COVID-19 pandemic, the focus of the Government Health Department shifted away from Polio drop delivery. The District Health Officer learnt about the strength of LSOs, in terms of their active leadership and organised networks, during this state of emergency. Due to the effective coordination of the organised communities, the COVID cases were controlled in the UC and the Polio drop delivery campaign was reinstated. The community leaders and Community Resource Persons (CRPs) were invited by the Health Department to offer their support in delivering polio drops. In order to ensure the efficient implementation of the campaign, the LSO leaders pre-announced the dates of visit in the nearby villages. This also allowed the community leaders to motivate the refusal cases, beforehand, to allow their children to receive Polio drops. The campaign was regularly monitored, and the missing children were reported to the Polio teams so that they could receive the vaccine during the follow-up visits. This dedicated effort of the community leaders has resulted in vaccination of almost 100% children in UC Nazarpur.
