An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Planted 1000 trees in different villages of the UC
- 2. Enrolled 150 children (100 boys and 50 girls) in school
- 3. Facilitated the vaccination of 150 individuals against COVID-19
- 4. Registered 200 CNICs and 50 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council
- 5. Provided **15 solar fans** to the needy families by collaborating with UC Chairman
- 6. Registered **150 poor** households in the Ehsas Rashan Programme
- 7. Built 250 washrooms and 15 hand pumps across the UC with the support of Mangi Memorial Trust
- 8. Conducted cleaning campaign (Safae Muham) across the Union Council
- 9. Distributed ration to 20 households from LSO savings during the COVID-19

Women leaders of LSO Eman are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are also taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Sheltering Each Other

Having a house is an underrated blessing. The houses in the villages are fragile as they are mostly made of clay and bricks only. A widow member of LSO Eman fro VO Jamelabad was deprived of shelter as her fragile house was ruined due to heavy rain. Due to her poor financial condition and lack of a decent source of income, she was unable to afford the reconstruction of the house. Understanding the gravity of situation, LSO leaders discussed the issue with other members and motivated them to support their fellow in need. In proceeding, a committee

was formed to take care of the issue and to collect money from the villagers. Upon collection of sufficient funds, a room was reconstructed to provide shelter to the needy. This initiative not only provided a living space to the poor family but also promoted harmony for a cause among the LSO members. As the LSO leaders mentioned, "Thanks to the SUCCESS programme. We realised the vitality of teamwork and helping each other".
