Background

The European Union funded Sindh Union Council and Community Economic Strengthening Support (SUCCESS) Programme is implemented by Rural Support Programmes (RSPs) namely National Rural Support Programmes (NRSP), Thardeep Rural Development Programme (TRDP) and Sindh Rural Support Organization (SRSO) with technical support of Rural Support Programmes Network (RSPN). The programme is being implemented in eight district of Sindh namely Matiari, Sujawal, Tando Allahyar, Tando Muhammad Khan, Jamshoro, Dadu, Kamber Shahdadkot and Larkana. The programme aims to stimulate community-driven local development initiatives to reduce poverty through RSPs successfully tested three-tier social mobilisation approach, empowering rural poor women and provide them opportunity to lead the community based intuitions and develop linkages with stake holders for providing better service delivery for sustainable development. To achieve objective of the SUCCESS programme, RSPs have fostered community institutions of the women Community Organisations (COs) at settlement, Village Organisations (VOs) at village and Local Support Organisations (LSOs) at Union Council (UC) levels by organising poorest households.

The RSPs and RSPN firmly believed that organised rural women through their mature, vibrant, viable, active and functional community institution can effectively implement the Community Driven Development (CDD) approach and reduce poverty in mentioned districts. Linkages development between Community Institutions (CIs), government line departments and other service providers in the programme areas holds significance. The linkages supported the CIs in two ways;

- 1. The service delivery at community level is improved through sharing the knowledge and experiences.
- 2. Learnings and ideas sharing increased the confidence of rural women community leaders which is also constructive step towards sustainable development.

Realising the importance of linkages development between CIs and other stakeholders especially government and sharing the experiences and learnings of SUCCESS Programme, RSPN in collaboration with NRSP and government line departments organised a **Dissemination Conference titled Taraqi ka Safar- "Journey towards Development"** in district Tando Allahyar on 16th March, 2022. This conference event is a link of a chain of dissemination conferences planned to be organised by RSPN in collaboration with RSPs and government authorities in all eight programme districts. Besides this these events also aimed to mark the achievements of rural organised women and the critical role played by them as agents of the social change in the society through their community institutions (COs/VOs/LSOs).

In order to showcase the work of organised trained rural women artisans and encourage their efforts, stalls were set in the Conference Hall. The delicate colorful handicrafts validated the artistry of the creative rural women and attracted the participants of the conference. The staff of PINS programme on WASH & AFSL sectors also set their stalls in the event. Besides this Government Health & Livestock departments also set their stalls in the conference Hall.

The Dissemination Conference was held at Almas Banquit, Tando Allahyar where the Commissioner Hyderabad Division Mr. Nadeem-ur-Rehman Memon was the chief guest. The

representatives of District Administration including Mr. Wali Muhammad Baloch Deputy Commissioner, Mr. Abdul Hazeez Laghari Additional Deputy Commissioner –I, Mr. Shahzado Umair Jarwar Additional Deputy Commissioner –II, All Assistant commissioners form three tehsils of Tando Allahyar, Mr. Farooque Ahmed Bijarani SSP Tando Allahyar and Mr. Ghulam Rasool Khero Provincial Coordinator SUCCES Progamme from RSPN were the special guests. Moreover, the representatives of all government line departments, civil society organisations, and media personnel, rural women from all 26 LSOs of District Tando Allahyar, programme beneficiaries and NRSP staff participated in the event.

The guests shared their valuable ideas regarding Community Driven Local Development (CDLD) and appreciated the rural women and CIs for their remarkable achievements and struggle for accessing the basic socio-economic services which contributed in improving the lives of rural poor communities.

Purpose of the Dissemination Conference

This event was an attempt to link the CIs and their women leaders with the government line departments and other service providers in the programme area. The event can also be regarded as a significant platform for all the SUCCESS programme stakeholders especially for the organised rural women for sharing their experience, learning, knowledge and practices that they gained through SUCCESS Programme interventions. So for linkages development has also yielded positive results and LSOs have conducted numerous activities with government line departments and other organisations. It is expected that through this conference these linkages between community institution and government authorities will be further strengthened and lead the CDD process towards sustainable development at grassroots level.

The conference aimed:

- ➤ To share the learning experiences and discuss the sustainable approaches to poverty graduation and women empowerment.
- ➤ To highlighted the achievements of organised rural women, critical role played by them for socio-economic development and paradigm shift in their lives over the period of past six (06) years of SUCCESS Programme
- ➤ Signify the role of community institutions COs/VOs/LSOs in sustainable socio-economic development and improvements of services delivery at community level.
- ➤ Linkages development between, Community Intuitions, government line departments and other service providers in the programme area.
- > To showcase work of organised trained rural women artisans and encourage their efforts

Significance of Community Driven Development and Women Empowerment

Mr. Ghulam Mustafa Haider Jamro, Programm Manager SUCCESS NRSP and Ms. Fozia Khaskheli District Programme Officer, NRSP district Tando Allahyar and Matiari described the objectives of the conference organised in recognition of the rural women's struggle to towards sustainable Community Driven Development (CDD) under the EU-funded SUCCESS programme.

Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Khero Coordinator **Provincial** of SUCCEES from RSPN delivered a comprehensive introduction **SUCCEES** programme. under this programme organised rural women and formed women community Institutions COs/VOs/LSOs and trained them through various types of trainings so that they can effectively run their institutions. Apart from this a series of awareness session on cross-cutting themes are also conducted with these community

organisation through trained Community Resource Persons (CRPs) so that the rural women can enhance their knowledge and practice around these cross cutting themes.

Mr. Khero said that this is the bitter truth of our society that women are always kept away from the education and financial resources because the capital/money has the power. He added that before the SUCCESS programme men dominated women and one major reason was the men's direct access to education and all financial resources of the households. Through the SUCCESS programme paradigm is now shifted and women are now aware of their basic rights and have access to financial resources. The women are actively participating in financial activities of their community institutions which includes, Community Investment Fund (CIF), Income Generating Grants (IGG), Micro Health Insurance (MHI), Community Physical Infrastructure (CPI) schemes and other bank related activities. This financial and institutional access gave the confidence to the rural women and make them more empowered and active in decision making. He further said that for the suitability and functionality of these organisations especially LSOs

need to establish a regular interaction with the District Government for sharing their needs, plans and implementation processes.

The event also shared the key learnings, knowledge and experiences of SUCCESS programme interventions and talked about the significance of developing linkages between CIs and stakeholders.

Representation of LSO Women Leaders and the Journey towards Development

The women community leaders from the Local Support Organisations (LSOs) shared their learnings and experiences through SUCCESS programme. Their views are separately given as under.

Ms. Ishrat General Secretary of LSO Began Jarwar gave a detailed presentation on the achievements of Highlighting her LSO. of **SUCCESS** importance programme increasing in the community confidence among women, she said, "today if I am a

common rural women able to present the work of our LSO in front of around thousand people this confidence is the result of SUCCEES programme''.

She mentioned that LSOs have not only made remarkable achievements under the programme interventions but beyond this LSO Began Jarwar have developed strong linkages with all the government line departments and other NGOs working in the district. Women community leaders are in close coordination with the government authorities and resultantly LSO Began Jarwar ensured registration of CNICs, and livestock vaccination in collaboration with district administration and health department. The LSO has a larger role in the community development, it is the platform from where community level plans become mature and are implemented therefore, it is imperative to link the LSOs with government authorities for sharing the plan and materializing them accordingly. She also told the participants that then linkages between community institutions and service providers/ the government are vital for making the CIs alive and active.

Ms. Paras Mehrani shared her own success story of becoming a CRP and the struggles since she was five when her father died and she started to support her family by selling confectionary

items. The SUCCESS programme started in 2016 in her UC and when she came to that the community know resource persons are needed in the VO, she decided to become a change agent. MS Paras said, "I started my work as CRP, sensitised and mobilised the communities through CATindicators. Initially it was difficult for me to go outside my village and visit other villages as society but my family supported

me. Today I feel proud, when I see that the people of my area especially women are engaged in development work and supporting their families". She highlighted that education is the most powerful and fundamental indicator for the socio-economic development. A meeting was conducted with Deputy Commissioner Tando Allahyar for providing a teacher in the school of her village which was closed due to unavailability of teacher and with her efforts school was reopened. She is also running a school on self-help basis with an enrolment of 235 children of marginalised "Jogi|" community.

Building Capacities of the Community as Strengthening Support

General Secretary of LSO Shahpur Rizvi, Ms. Rani highlighted the role of women led community institutions in sustainable development, empowerment and women leadership. She

In the conference she talked about the issues women face including the exclusion from the income generating activities and hindrance in women empowerment avenues. The violence against women which includes early and forced marriages, domestic violence, fear, , lack of access towards financial resources and etc. were usual and the women incidents. Rani mentioned that the inclusion of women



were the primary victim of these Ms. Rani GS LSO Shahpur Rizvi highlighted the importance of

SUCCESS programme has brought a positive change in the lives of people especially women which were previously regarded as disadvantage segment of the society. The formation of women led community institutions, orientation, nurturing and training of women have enabled them to work for their communities which also enhance the respect of women in the society. Ms. Rani said, 'I never thought that a women from our community (hindu) who even cannot speak in front of her in-laws one day will become the leader of an institution and share the stage with the dignitaries sitting here it is just because of SUCCESS programme that I am before you on the stage". Linkages among the community institutions and the government departments should be increased for future development endeavours.

Collaboration with Government of Sindh

Commissioner Hyderabad, Mr Nadeem-ur-Rehman Memon admired the rural women and their community institution (COs/VOs/LSOs) for the selfless services towards rural development. He mentioned that the SUCCESS programme built the capacities, confidence and increased awareness of rural women which make the empowered and enabled them to come forward and share their opinions, progress, plans and achievements before every one on

The commissioner also underlined the role of NRSP and community intuitions in combating the COVID-19 and ensuring the vaccination.

Women inclusion through organised institutions

Deputy commissioner Tando Allahyar, Mr. Wali Muhammad Baloch said that in order to create

a developed and well-versed society it is very important that women should be included in the development processed. Women are not only born to give birth to children and should not be limited to the households, now women are doing great job for the sustainable development of the society through community organisations their (COs/VOs/LSOs) and their todays presence, sharing of experience and achievements. displaying their

crafts is the evidence of their empowerment and determination. He appreciated the central role of NRSP in supporting and capacitating the community institutions and their women leaders. He assured all the possible support to the CIs from the government line departments.

In order showcase the handicrafts, and leanings through **SUCCESS Technical** and Skills Vocational (TVST) component, different stall were set to display handmade items of embroidery, applique work, crochet work, adda (frame) work traditional dresses of women, children, Sindhi traditional items e.g. Rillis, Sindhi caps etc. The visitors from different walks of the life visited stall and not only purchased the traditional gifts but also appreciated the women






