An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted 930 awareness sessions on various health and education related topics.
- 2. Planted 2,757 trees in different villages of the Union Council
- 3. Enrolled 1,984 children (1,275 boys and 702 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **10,470 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered 9,344 CNICs, 1,273 B-forms, 346 Nikkah Namas, and around 30 death certificates in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **1,840 animals** with the help of Livestock Department
- 7. Vaccinated 600 individuals against polio through free-of-cost polio camp with the help of Government Health Department

Women leaders of LSO Jhandomari are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are also taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Accessing Safe Drinkable Water

The people of Union Council Jhandomari were denied their basic human right by not having access to clean drinkable water. Utilisation of saline and contaminated water for drinking and cooking purposes causes diarrheal diseases. Therefore, the community members would travel long distances to collect potable water. This long standing issue was resolved by the Leaders of Local Support Organisation (LSO) Jhandomari. The LSO members highlighted the matter in their monthly meetings and contacted the UC chairman for assistance. The request was taken up by the UC chairman, who offered installation of water pumps. As of now, there are at least 15-25 water pumps in each village within the Union Council and this access to clean water has promoted the health and hygiene of the community greatly.
