An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **7,200 awareness sessions** on various health and education related topics
- 2. Planted 1,200 trees in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 1,000 children (700 boys and 300 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **8,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered 7,080 CNICs, 200 B-forms, and 260 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **250 animals** with the help of Livestock Department

Women leaders of **LSO Mirabad** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are also taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Power Supply Through Renewable Energy

With no supply of electricity to power fans and lightbulbs in Union Council Mirabad, the heat becomes difficult to bear during days and the villages plunge further into darkness at night. This leaves the residents unable to complete different tasks, wasting their time and delaying their work. When the Local Support Organisation (LSO) members brought this issue to the notice of the UC Chairman, it was

acted upon after a while. The plausible solution in this case was installation of solar panels. Therefore, around 100-150 households in Mirabad were provided with solar plates along with the batteries. Through this, the locals powered lightbulbs and fans. Now, the villagers can rest under fans during hot summer days, the children can study and women are able to earn by stitching clothes at night.
