An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **64 sessions** educating **756 individuals** on cleanliness, family planning, and COVID-19
- 2. Planted **7,500 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled **2,800 children** (1,500 boys and 1,300 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **4,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered **3,500 CNICs, 500 B-forms, 60 Nikkah Namas,** and **40 death certificates** in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **3,000 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department
- 7. Treated **1,900 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of the Government Health Department
- 8. Provided stipend worth **PKR 12,000** to **1,000 households** by the help of Benazir Income Support Programme

Women leaders of **LSO Ehsas** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Emergency Food Relief During COVID-19 Pandemic

The economic impact of COVID-19 pandemic was worst for the villagers of Union Council (UC) BeroChandio. Due to upsurge of unemployment, the community were left unable to afford basic food items to survive. The Local Support Organisation (LSO) Ehsas pointed out the magnitude of this issue in their monthly meeting and realised that an immediate action was required for this purpose. Therefore, the Chairman of UC BeroChandio was invited to the LSO meeting and an appeal for aid was made. After several more meetings to convince the UC Chairman. the request was finally accepted, and 150 households were provided with ration packs. This initiative was able to provide immediate and direct assistance to the families who were in urgent need of food to survive.





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
