What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **58 sessions** educating **1,056 individuals** on Breast Cancer, COVID-19 and Cleanliness
- 2. Planted 6,500 trees in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 3,000 children (2,500 boys and 500 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **10,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered **6,500 CNICs, 3,000 B-forms, 700 Nikkah Namas,** and **50 death certificates** in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **8,000 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department
- 7. Treated **2,000 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of the Government Health Department
- 8. Provided stipend worth **PKR 14,000** to **99 households** by the help of Benazir Income Support Programme
- 9. Distributed food ration packs to **100 households** by the help of UC Chairman

Women leaders of **LSO Maqsad Khushhali** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realizing the power they gain from collective action. The organized women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Toilet Construction by Mangi Memorial Trust

Open defecation had become a major problem for the villagers of Shahpur Sikandarabad by causing severe health insecurities. Considering the sensitivity of the issue, members of the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Magsad Khushhali decided to work on it immediately. The LSO members held several meetings, came up with the formation of a committee, and assigned it the task to approach Mangi Memorial Trust requesting their aid in the cause. The committee then had meetings with the Trust, laid out the circumstances, and appealed for construction of toilets in the village. The Mangi Memorial Trust after visiting the Union Council (UC) approved their request and constructed 18 toilets in village Shahpur Sikandarabad. Availability of the toilets helped the villagers being rid of outbreaks and allowed them enjoy a clean pleasant environment.
