#### What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

### Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted 154 sessions educating 3,130 individuals on COVID-19, Family Planning and Cleanliness
- 2. Planted 6,500 trees in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 6,000 children (2,000 boys and 4,000 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **12,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered 4,000 CNICs, 5,000 B-forms, 450 Nikkah Namas, and 100 death certificates in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated 4,000 animals with the help of the Livestock Department
- 7. Treated **10,000 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of the Government Health Department
- 8. Provided stipend worth 12,000 to 200 households by the help of Benazir Income Support Program
- 9. Opened a shop for a female through the savings in village kher Bux Mariz
- 10.Installed 50 Solar panels 20 fans and 10 solar road lights, 50 hand pumps with the help of UC chairman
- 11. Provided 1,000 Masks and 1,000 soaps to individuals by the help of HANDS

Women leaders of LSO Maseeha are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realizing the power they gain from collective action. The organized women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

#### Supporting A Needy Woman

Poverty hits different individuals differently putting them in a situation where they do not find a single mean of livelihood. Such was a case of a poor woman from the village Kher Bux Mari who had no source of income since her husband was also unemployed. She went to the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Masiha during their meeting to seek their help. She requested the LSO members to raise funds in order to open a shop for her husband so that he could earn some income for their survival.

The LSO leaders after conducting a number of meetings planned to collect money from the members and help her. All members agreed on it and started collecting money. With the funds collected by the LSO members, she has been able to open a shop and her husband is managing and earning guite better from the shop. The initiative has not only helped them in improving their livelihood, it also became a running source for their survival.
