An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **24 sessions** educating **360 individuals** on COVID-19
- 2. Planted **2,500 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled **4,500 children** (**2,500 boys and 1,500 girls**) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **2,100 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered 2,500 CNICs, 4,000 B-forms, and 600 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated 1,800 animals with the help of the Livestock Department
- 7. Treated **2,800 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of the Government Health Department

Women leaders of **LSO Sartiyoon Sobh** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realizing the power they gain from collective action. The organized women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Safeguarding Formal Education

The community school in Village Qaim Khan Chandio in the Union Council (UC) Misri Khan Chandio was closed due to its poor condition and functioning. As the parents could not afford to send their children to the nearby private schools, therefore, to make sure their children complete their primary level education they approached the leaders of the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Sartiyoon Sobh for their help. The LSO leaders in response invited the UC chairman to the LSO's monthly meeting and discussed the issue. This resulted in the UC Chairman providing funds for school supplies and renovation. Moreover, he also connected them to the Education Department demanding the appointment of the required school staff. Shortly after the appointment of schoolteachers and the renovation of the building, the school was resumed. The children of Village Qaim Khan Chandio have now returned to school and they have continued their education.
