What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.


Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **148 sessions** educating **6,050 individuals** on COVID-19, Family Planning and cleanliness
- 2. Planted 15,000 trees in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 5,000 children (2,500 boys and 2,500 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **15,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered **800 CNICs, 500 B-forms, 250 Nikkah Namas,** and **10 death certificates** in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **2,500 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department
- 7. Provide Stipend worth **PKR 12,000** to **900 households** by the help of Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP)
- 8. Distributed **Food Ration Packs** to **200 households** by the help of the UC Chairman

Women leaders of **LSO Shafaq** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realizing the power they gain from collective action. The organized women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Plantation Drive in the UC Gul Muhammad Chacho

The dry land of the Union Council (UC) Gul Muhammad Chacho would absorb much heat during summers and make the days and nights difficult to tolerate. Not only did it increase the risk of heatstroke among the UC dwellers, but it also hindered their work. Being mindful of these concerns the community members soon realised that the need for tree plantation in their UC is necessary. Therefore, an agenda to plant trees in the UC was discussed in the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Shafag's monthly meeting, where the leaders of the LSO formulated the plan and budgeted the activity through local community contribution. All the LSO and community members agreed and money was collected as per the ability to afford and determination of the members. Through this initiative, the LSO leaders were able to buy and plant 500 trees in their courtyards. Whereas the community now feels overjoyed in making their environment fresh and pleasant for the generations to come.
