An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted 50 sessions educating 2,412 individuals on various health and educational topics
- 2. Planted **50 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 810 children (500 boys and 310 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of 2,153 individuals against COVID-19
- 5. Registered **2,450 CNICs, 20 B-forms, 25 Nikkah Namas, 60 death certificates** and registered **2,450 votes** in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated 2,513 animals with the help of Livestock Department
- 7. Treated **3,215 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of Government Health Department
- 8. Facilitated 1,280 women at health centres for safe deliveries

Women leaders of the **LSO Azaadi** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Enrolment of Children in School

In rural communities having poor economic backgrounds, people were compelled to send their children to work in the fields instead of sending them to schools. They used to prefer labour to education for their children so that they would help them meet the family's basic livelihood needs. Similarly, poverty was one of the contributing factors to the low literacy rates in the Union Council (UC) Chandan. Leaders of the local Support Organisation (LSO) Azaad decided to work on this matter through Community Resource Persons (CRPs). The CRPs conducted the community awareness toolkit (CAT) sessions, guided, and helped the community members to understand the significance of education. After those sessions, enrolment in schools has increased. Parents now willingly send their children to school.
