An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **64 sessions** educating **30,000 individuals** on various health and education topics
- 2. Planted 3,658 trees in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 5,732 children (2,172 boys and 3,560 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of 1,300 individuals against COVID-19
- 5. Facilitated the vaccination of **5,690 children** against polio
- 6. Registered **6,733 CNICs**, **1,239 B-forms**, **1,576 Nikkah Namas**, **1,723 death certificates** and **6,700 electoral votes** in the Union Council
- 7. Vaccinated **5,560 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department
- 8. Treated 5,690 patients for free through a medical health camp with the help of Government Health Department
- 9. Facilitated **2,000 women** at hospitals with safe deliveries
- 10. Distributed ration bags to **400 households** in the UC, during COVID-19 pandemic
- 11. Provided 30 households with solar plates and 20 households with fans in the UC
- 12. Reopened 1 formerly closed school in the UC
- 13. Arranged 8 Medical Camps in the UC
- 14. Constructed a 2 Km concrete cement road in the UC

Women leaders of the **LSO Azaan** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Improving Transportation Accessibility

The poorly constructed pathways served as a flood hazard in the Union Council (UC) Pipri. During the rainy seasons, the water remained stagnant for days, which restricted the community's access to work, schooling and healthcare, thus compromising their health and welfare. Weary of this issue, the dwellers from the UC Pipri, reached out to their Local Support Organisation (LSO) Azaan for help. As a result, the leaders of the LSO met with the UC chairman and the District Commissioner (DC) to discuss this issue and placed an application for road construction. After a few follow-up meetings and multiple visits to the UC, the chairman and DC permitted the construction of a linked road in the UC which was completed within two months and since then people have an easy access to places.
