An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **90 sessions** educating **7,500 individuals** on various health and educational topics
- 2. Planted **6,000 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 2,000 children (1,200 boys and 800 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **10,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered **5,000 CNICs**, **700 B-forms**, **900 Nikkah Namas**, **270 death certificates** and **5,000 electoral votes** in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **5,000 animals** with the help of Livestock Department
- 7. Treated 3,000 patients for free through a medical health camp with the help of Government Health Department
- 8. Facilitated **7,500 women** at hospitals with safe deliveries
- 9. Distributed ration bags to **20 households** in the UC, during COVID-19 pandemic
- 10. Installed **20 water pumps**, constructed **10 rooms** and provided **10 sewing machines** and **15 beautician kits** by the help of IRC
- 11. Renovated 1 school in the UC
- 12. Provided 5 wheelchairs and 20 crutches to physically impaired individuals in the UC

Women leaders of the **LSO Lal Qalandar** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Going Green: Promoting Plantation

The absence of trees in the Union Council (UC) Mondar resulted in extremely hot weather and no place to rest during hot days of the summer. Villagers had no choice but to go out and work under the sun, which led to frequent cases of heat stroke. To solve this issue, the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Lal Qalander's leaders arranged a monthly meeting and a drive for tree plantation was planned. Whereas for assistance Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) was approached by the LSO leaders. In collaboration with FAO, awareness sessions on the importance and methods of tree plantation were organised and later the community members were provided with seeds as well. As a result, the villagers planted multiple trees. The community now looks after these plants and feels satisfied by contributing to a cooler environment for the generations to come.
