An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



#### What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

## Activities implemented through the EU funded SUCCESS Programme



LSO managing CIF Amount of PKR **4,884,000**Initial sub-grant as CIF



Community Investment Fund (CIF) amount of PKR 6,607,000 disbursed to 253 households

# Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted 60 sessions educating 16,000 individuals on various health and educational topics
- 2. Planted **3,000 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 1,100 children (400 boys and 700 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of 1,200 individuals against COVID-19
- 5. Registered **1,800 CNICs**, **2,000 B-forms**, **900 Nikkah Namas**, **450 death certificates** and **1,200 electoral votes** in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **5,500 animals** with the help of Livestock Department
- 7. Treated 1,580 patients for free through a medical health camp with the help of Government Health Department
- 8. Facilitated **3,500 women** at hospitals for safe deliveries
- 9. Reopened 4 formerly closed schools in the UC
- 10. Distributed ration bags to **50 households** in the UC, during COVID-19 pandemic
- 11. Supported **25 deserving women** and **4 men** with medical billing
- 12. Constructed 600 washrooms and 5 water tanks in the UC
- 13. Distributed 5 sewing machines and 20 solar panels to the needy community in the UC
- 14. Assisted 15 girls in starting small businesses

Women leaders of the **LSO Madina** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

### **Assuring Quality Education**

The enrolment in government schools of the Union Council (UC) Johi was around 1,100 students. However, these schools lacked professional teachers, who have been receiving salaries being government employees yet not shown up to the schools. Leaders of the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Madina held a meeting on this issue and as a prompt solution decided to hire volunteer teachers from the community. Whereas to pay them the LSO leaders requested the LSO members to contribute as per their capacity. Meanwhile, the LSO leaders contacted the Government Education Department in order to appoint professional teachers for the schools. The government officials took action and as a result, multiple teachers were appointed to four different schools within the UC Johi. This has increased school attendance and more families enrolled their children in these schools.
