What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **70 sessions** educating **10,000 individuals** on various health and educational topics
- 2. Planted **50,000 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 5,000 children (1,500 boys and 3,500 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **2,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Facilitated the vaccination of **700 children** against polio and measles
- 6. Registered **6,000 CNICs**, **12,000 B-forms**, **2000 Nikkah Namas**, **500 death certificates** and **15,000 electoral votes** in the Union Council
- 7. Vaccinated **25,000 animals** with the help of Livestock Department
- 8. Treated 15,000 patients for free through a medical health camp with the help of Government Health Department
- 9. Facilitated **1,800 women** at hospitals with safe deliveries
- 10. Repaired 40 water hand pumps in the UC
- 11. Assisted **250 women** in starting small businesses
- 12. Provided 900 goats and 1,100 hens to the needy community of the UC through the help of World Food Program (WFP)
- 13. Assisted 600 individuals in getting health cards from Sehat Sahulat Programme
- 14. Supported 3 deserving individuals with medical billing through the LSO savings
- 15. Assisted **1 member** of Community Organisation in purchasing a cow through the LSO savings

Women leaders of the **LSO Manzil** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Eradicating Polio in the Union Council (UC) Amri

There were wide-ranging misconceptions against oral polio vaccine drops among the less educated, rural community of the Union Council (UC) Amri. Where few households refused the polio team visiting their homes, others had been unattended due to the unavailability at times when the polio team visited. To put an end to this practice leaders of the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Manzil gathered the community and explained to them the immunisation process and its necessity. Later the LSO leaders actively supported the Government Health Department for effective Polio vaccination in the UC as well. To avoid children being missed by the polio team the LSO leaders communicated the dates and places for vaccination across the UC through the developed LSO networks. Whereas the refusal households were visited door to door. As a result, 700 children have been vaccinated against polio. With the success of this initiative, the LSO leaders have planned to do so in the coming years as well.
