An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

LSO Initiatives

Micro Health Insurance (MHI) provided benefitting **20,883** people/population covered



Adult Literacy and Numeracy Skills (ALNS) educating **201** female beneficiaries through **04** learning Centres

Community Physical Infrastructure (CPI):

5 schemes (3 schemes completed and 2 are ongoing)

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Planted 900 trees in different villages of the UC
- 2. Enrolled 755 children in schools
- 3. Facilitated the vaccination of 12,425 individuals against COVID-19
- 4. Registered 680 CNICs, 4,848 B-Forms and 542 Nikkah Namas in the UC
- 5. Vaccinated 620 animals with the help of Livestock Department
- 6. Treated **700 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of Government Health Department

Women leaders of the **LSO Jarki** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are also taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Safeguarding Survival of the Poorest Households

The pandemic of COVID-19 put the poorest households into further challenges following the lockdown. The president of the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Jarki made earnest efforts to help the deserved households who were in financial crisis and did not have any source of income. The LSO president connected with the Chairman Union Council (UC) and individually requested his assistance in helping the needy households. However, finding out the situation, the UC Chairman provided those households with monthly ration bags and distributed stitching machines to the deserving women of the LSO Jarki who possessed skills in stitching clothes. The initiative protected them from starvation and provided an opportunity to earn some income by stitching clothes.
