What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Planted **1,020 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 2. Enrolled **2,404 children** in schools
- 3. Facilitated the vaccination of **2,135 individuals** against COVID-19
- 4. Registered 1,010 CNICs, 2,600 B-forms and 1,953 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council
- 5. Vaccinated **1,180 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department

Women leaders of the **LSO Makhdooman Joon Landhiyon** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realizing the power they gain from collective action. The organized women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Creating Earning Opportunities for Women

The Union Council (UC) Makhdooman Joon Landhiyon had a local training centre for sewing and tailoring work. Therefore, leaders of the Local Support organisation (LSO) mobilised all the community women to utilise this opportunity and learn tailoring. However, due to poverty they were unable to buy sewing machines to earn. To help these women out, the LSO leaders contacted the UC chairman and asked for financial support. After having multiple meetings with the UC chairman, the LSO leaders were finally able to get approved their demand. Around 40-50 sewing machines were provided to the poorest households. Through the initiative, the women feel contented, as they are helping their family's livelihood sustainability since they are now able to apply their learnt skills, they stitch clothes and sell it for PKR 200-250 per suit.
