An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Planted 4,000 trees in different villages of the UC
- 2. Enrolled 975 children in schools
- 3. Facilitated the vaccination of 4,000 individuals against COVID-19
- 4. Registered **2,253 CNICs, 870 B-forms, 460 Nikkah Namas,** and **635 death certificates** in the Union Council
- 5. Vaccinated 975 animals with the help of Livestock Department
- 6. Treated **200 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of Government Health Department

Women leaders of the **LSO Rawat Laghari** are planning and implementing development activities both on self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are also taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Provision of Basic Health Facilities

Access to better health opportunities such as basic health units and the availability of clinical or medical staff is the prime need of every individual. In the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Rawat Laghari District Tando Allahyar, the hospital lacked a doctor and other paramedical staff. People who could afford travel expenses used to go to other Union Councils (UCs) for check-ups and other medical purposes and those who could not afford had no choice except to stay home and rely on home remedies. However, this major issue was highlighted by the LSO leaders in meetings with Government Officials. They linked with the District Health Department and requested the appointment of medical staff and doctors in the hospital. Considering the need of the people, the government officials approved their request and appointed doctors and other medical staff in the hospital at LSO Rawat Laghari. This was a great favour to the community people as they no longer have to rely on self-medication.
