An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

4. Registered 1,500 CNICs, 2,648 B-forms and 1,846 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council

5. Vaccinated **510 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department

Women leaders of the **LSO Sikanderabad** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realizing the power they gain from collective action. The organized women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Mitigating the Water Stagnation Issues

During the monsoon season in the months of June and July 2022, the low spots in the Union Council (UC) Sikanderabad were filled due to excessive rain. This resulted in water stagnation and welcoming different waterborne diseases. When multiple children started having fevers, leaders of the Local Support Organisation (LSO) Sikanderabad, visited the UC chairman and requested help with the issue. As the UC chairman agreed, he arranged for a drainage pump in the UC through which all the stagnant water was drained out into the free spaces. Whereas, to avoid this issue in the long run the LSO leaders united the community members and filled all the holes and levelled the surfaces of the field. Now the water does not stand, and the risk of water-borne diseases has also been reduced.
