An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Planted 1,128 trees in different villages of the UC
- 2. Enrolled **1,655 children** in schools
- 3. Facilitated the vaccination of **800 individuals** against COVID-19
- 4. Registered 3,144 CNICs and 500 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council
- 5. Vaccinated **880 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department

Women leaders of the **LSO Zair Pir** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realizing the power they gain from collective action. The organized women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Improving Living Standards Through Electricity Supply

The lack of electricity was affecting the education of the children and youth in the Union Council (UC) Zair Pir. Unable to power lightbulbs, they could not study properly at night. Worried about their children's future the parents from the UC highlighted this issue in the Local Support Organisation's (LSO) monthly meetings and appealed to the LSO leaders for their help. In response, the LSO leaders sent an application to the UC chairman requesting the provision of solar panels, plates and batteries to the needy community in the UC. Soon the UC chairman agreed and provided the LSO leaders with 40 solar panels, which were installed shortly after. As of now, the youth not only study at night but the villagers are also able to power fans through sustainable energy sources.
