An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Conducted **268 sessions** educating **individuals 4,270** on COVID-19 awareness, family planning, and hygiene and cleanliness
- 2. Planted **17,000 trees** in different villages of the UC
- 3. Enrolled 5,000 children (3,000 boys and 2,000 girls) in school
- 4. Facilitated the vaccination of **18,000 individuals** against COVID-19
- 5. Registered **2,000 CNICs, 1,000 B-forms, 300 Nikkah Namas,** and **100 death certificates** in the Union Council
- 6. Vaccinated **15,000 animals** with the help of the Livestock Department
- 7. Treated **1,500 patients** for free through a medical health camp with the help of the Government Health Department
- 8. Provided stipend worth PKR 12,000 to 1,500 houses through Benazir Income Support EHSAAS program
- 9. Provided ration packs to **100 houses** through the help of UC Chairman
- 10. Provided **960 households** with soaps and face masks through Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (PINS)
- 11. Provided ration packs to 100 houses through the help of UC Chairman
- 12. Provided **960 households** with soaps and face masks through Programme for Improved Nutrition in Sindh (PINS)

Women leaders of **LSO Aagaz** are planning and implementing development activities both on a self-help basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS program is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable, and are also taking self-initiative to improve their lives.

Protection Against Summer Heat

Heatwave, that is declared when the temperature rises above 40 degrees Celsius, is considered an average weather during summers in Sindh. Prolonged exposure to the unbearable sun causes body to overheat, which results in a fatal condition known as "heatstroke". It is particularly common among individuals living in Union Council Pathan, as they work in the fields during the day and are unable to rest in fans due to lack of electricity supply upon returning home. To avoid more individuals getting affected due to the hot weather, the leaders of Local Support Organisation (LSO) Aagaz came together and set up a meeting with the Chairman of UC Pathan. They explained the seriousness of the issue concerning health of the community members and were able to convince the UC chairman for assistance, who provided 30 solar panels and 30 fans to the LSO. Now the dwellers feel quite at ease and look forward to returning home from work to rest well and safely.
