An update on the work of Local Support Organisations



What are LSO?

LSOs or Local Support Organisations are a Union Council level federation of Community Institutions. In a bid to reduce poverty at the household level and empower marginalised people (esp. women), they carry out community-led development and develop linkages with government and non-government organisations.

Activities implemented through self-help and in collaboration with Government and other development agencies:

- 1. Planted 2,414 trees in different villages of the UC
- 2. Enrolled 2,414 children in schools
- 3. Facilitated the vaccination of 2,500 individuals against COVID-19
- 4. Registered 7,604 CNICs, 1,154 B-forms and 1,021 Nikkah Namas in the Union Council
- 5. Vaccinated **700 animals** with the help of Livestock Department.

Women leaders of the **LSO Bakh** are planning and implementing development activities both on selfhelp basis as well as in collaboration with government agencies. The EU-funded SUCCESS programme is empowering rural women in Sindh by realising the power they gain from collective action. The organised women are gaining awareness about their rights, making the service providers accountable and are also taking self-initiatives to improve their lives.

Provision of Sewing Machines

Women in rural Sindh tend to learn stitching skills within the community. This reduces the cost of stitching their own clothes and establishes a reliable source of income. However, in Union Council (UC) Wahur, a sizable number of trained women could not afford to buy a sewing machine. This issue was raised in Community Organisation (CO) and Village Organisation (VO) meetings and was brought into the notice of the Local Support Organisation (LSO). The LSO leaders discussed the matter with the UC Chairman and asked for his support. The UC Chairman provided 160 sewing machines to the LSO on the condition that they distribute it amongst the poorest women. The LSO identified such women using their local knowledge and distributed the sewing machines within the community. They provided a signed affidavit and copies of Computerised National Identity Cards (CNICs) of the recipient women to the UC Office.
