What is Legal Empowerment?

Legal empowerment is about strengthening the capacity of all people to exercise their rights, either as individuals or as members of a community, to find practical solutions to their justice problems, and hold government to account.

Levels of Legal Empowerment

First-Order Interventions:

legal literacy

Second-Order Interventions:

resolving specific legal problems

Third-Order Interventions:

- public interest litigation;
- policy and law reform advocacy;
- justice system reform;
- corruption monitoring.
