1) Capacity Building

RSPN through its partners conducted various training programs for V/UDMC members during the reporting quarter. The trainings consisted of two days refresher course for old VDMCs besides more comprehensive five days training course for new VDMCs on Participatory Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) and Disaster Risk Management & Planning (DRMP). The target of new VDMC members to be trained on PDRA and DRMP was achieved during the reporting quarter. Over all 2279 new VDMC members are trained out of which 1146 are male and 1133 are female members.

Similarly target of training the remaining 75 new UDMC members on Advocacy & Networking was also achieved in the same quarter.

2) Community Resource Persons and Awareness Sessions

Community Resource Persons (CRP) are the VDMC members selected on pre-post evaluation conducted before and after each training event. The objective of creating this cadre of CRP is to transfer knowledge at the grass root level in the community. The field teams have identified and selected 869 CRPs till now of which 422, almost half are women Each CRP is expected to deliver total of 10 sessions in two settlements (05 sessions /settlement). By end of this quarter the CRPs have conducted awareness sessions in 1679 settlement out of 1840

targeted settlements. The activity will continue till end of current project period. Local community is taking great interest in these sessions and these are attended by quite large number of local residents including men women and even children.

3) DRM Plans and Community Critical Infrastructure (CCIs)

After receiving training in participatory disaster risk assessment and disaster risk management and planning, the VDMC members develop Disaster Risk Management Plan (DRMP) for their village. All planned 228 DRMP have been successfully developed which shows all potential risks, hazards, resources and possible mitigation measures. Based on these DRMPs, communities identified 228 small infrastructure schemes to be rehabilitated as CCI. Out of these prioritized 228 schemes physical work has been initiated on 199 schemes so far. By end of the reporting quarter a total of only 50 CCIs could be completed as against the set target of 159 i.e. only 31% achievement against the planned number. The field teams have been asked to give focused attention towards this so that we can complete all schemes within project period.

4) VDMC & UDMC Meeting

These meetings are arranged with the main objective of bringing the members at a platform to discuss current situation, build up coordination and develop plans to combat any unpleasant situation at village and UC level. During the reporting periods these meetings mainly focused on a cyclone that threatened the entire project area. The cyclone named Niolfar was expected to hit the coastal areas and also had threats for the desert region. The UDMCs from coastal areas were in close contact with district administration and at various places they facilitated the administration in collecting primary data from the field. By end of reporting quarter 64 such meetings were held at different places.

5) Celebration of International DRR Day

The International Day for Disaster Reduction is celebrated every year on 13th October. The main focus of organizing DRR day is to raise awareness among communities about risks of various disasters including earthquakes, drought situations, floods and cyclones. During the reporting quarter international DRR day was celebrated in all four project districts. Walks and rallies were arranged to raise awareness and highlight significance of the day which emphasises on the need of undertaking early preparedness, management and mitigation measures etc. These events were participated by large number of people from all walks of life.

6) Intra District Exposure Visit

The objective of this event was to provide an opportunity of bringing together the community representatives from different disaster prone regions so that they can share and learn from each other's experience. During the quarter, the selected member of UDMCs from the coastal belt visited the desert area. This visit helped in enhancing their knowledge and learning through exchange of information, experiences and best practices adopted by different communities. Like CCIs, this activity was also under achieved as representatives from only two districts could go to other region. The remaining two districts will be covered in next quarter.

7) District Level Advocacy & Networking Workshops

These workshops are basically conducted to share CBDRM approach with various stakeholders including government officials, other NGOs, media persons and community members from V/UDMCs & LSO representatives. All planned targets were achieved during this quarter. These workshops were attended by large number of people from different government, NGO and community organizations. These events serve as a platform to build up links and coordination between communities and service providers.

8) Knowledge Retention Assessment

An internal assessment was carried out to see the level of knowledge retention in members of VDMCs who received trainings in PDRA and DRM&P. Main purpose of this assessment was to find out effectiveness of the capacity building component of Tahafuz project. A report is being developed on this and will be shared during next quarter.

9) Emergency Tool Kits

This activity got considerably delayed as the process of distribution was planned to be completed in the last quarter. During the quarter one of the implementing partners, NRSP, has completed the tendering process and purchase order has been issued to the vendors. Similarly the other implementing partner TRDP has expedited working on tendering process and it is hoped that procurement and distribution of emergency toolkit will be completed during next month.

10) General

- A team from USAID including AOR Ms. Margo, Ms Jacqueline, Mr. Kennedy Mr. Ali Gohar Khan and Ms. Patricia visited project districts Thatta and Badin. Their original plan was to visit Tharparkar but due to various reasons they could not go there and spent a day with communities in Thatta and Badin,
