## 1) Mitigation Measures:

### i) Community Critical Infrastructure-CCIs

USAID awarded No Cost Extension 1-2 weeks prior to completion of project period. During this period RSPN continued its project activities and identified 15 out of the 31 additional schemes on need basis of community. These identified CCIs have also been reflected in the quarter performance report ending 31<sup>st</sup> March 2015. The remaining target (Identification of 16 schemes) was achieved during the same quarter period. It is also worth mentioning here that all the schemes are identified by community members from already developed 228 Disaster Risk Management Plans at revenue village level.

The identified schemes need to be initiated physically and completed in time in order to achieve project's objectives. As shown in the achievement table RSPN and its implementing partners were able to initiate and complete the entire 259 schemes during the same quarter.

### ii) Emergency Tool Kits-ETKs

To cater for emergency needs of the flood and drought prone project areas, one standardized Emergency Tool Kit has been provided to each UDMC.

During the reporting quarter RSPN and its implementing partners distributed the remaining 10 ETKs among targeted UDMCs. Events for distribution of kit were held at District Tharparkar and Umerkot in the presence of the Assistant Deputy Commissioner, District Officer Social Welfare and UDMCs & LSOs representatives. The key items included in the tool kit are: First-aid bag, tents, life jackets, safety helmets, flash lights, climbing ropes, megaphones, chain pulley, folding stretchers, ladder bamboo, wheel barrows, shovels etc.

A memorandum of understanding concerning to the security and maintenance of emergency tool kits was also signed by the officials and the respective UDMCs as well as the RSPs.

### 2) General

RSPN has submitted a 12 month proposal for Cost Modification to USAID/OFDA for approval; however a Pre-Modification Letter has been awarded to continue project activities till August, 14 2015. The proposal has cleared programmatic and technical grounds of USAID/OFDA policies and hopefully Cost Modification will be awarded before or till Premodification period ends.
